Course description:

The theory, practice, and procedures relating to the preparation and use of accounting records and reports with an emphasis on service and mercantile-oriented enterprises. This course concentrates on the Principles of Accounting, the usage of debits and credits, the analysis of business transactions, the completed counting cycle, the preparation of the basic financial statements, principles of inventory, the preparation of bank reconciliations, and the calculation and interpretation of basic financial analysis. (Chapters 1 – 9)

Student Learning Outcomes:

- 1) Demonstrate knowledge of double entry accounting for business transactions and adjustments.
- 2) Prepare, explain, and analyze an income statement, statement of owner's equity and balance sheet using GAAP and identify the various users of financial statements.
- 3) Identify ethical issues in an accounting context.
- 4) Analyze fundamental business concepts, how businesses operate and how accounting serves them.

Midterms:

There will be four midterms. I will automatically drop the lowest midterm (not the final). If you received an 'F' on a midterm due to a cheating problem, you may NOT drop that midterm. If you have work conflicts, athletics, etc., you must make alternative

Final Exam:

This is a comprehensive exam covering all nine chapters we have studied this quarter. It is not an optional exam **and must be taken at the scheduled time.**

Quizzes - 40 points

Chapter quizzes will not be announced. These in-class quizzes will be closed book and closed notes. There will be no makeup for missed quizzes. The quizzes will range in value from 7 to 10 points. There will be more than 40 points available throughout the quarter.

Homework - 40 points

Homework will be on-line and manually done. Both online and manual homework will be worth a maximum of 5 points. There will be one online HW per chapter and will be graded by the CengageNow. Manual homework will be accepted only on the assigned day during the first 15 minutes of class AND must be a **photo or scanned copy** of your original manual homework. There may be more than one manual homework per chapter for a maximum of 5 points per chapter. Again, there will be more than 40 points available to make your total of 40 points.

Project – 20 points

There will be one group project assignment due. You will be graded on your cooperation within the group and on the successful completion of the project by your group.

Quizzes – Extra Credit

The on-line quizzes due the same day the chapter is assigned to be read are extra credit. There will be 9 quizzes and each will be graded by the homework online system. The quizzes are worth 5 points each for a maximum of 40 points possible.
