**Course Objectives:**

- Accounting 1B is the second course in a three course series at De Anza College. It provides instructions in the theory and concepts underlying preparation of financial statements utilizing generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP).
- Subjects include coverage of assets valuation, revenue and expense recognition and appropriate accounting for asset, liability, and capital accounts.

**Course Structure:**

This course will be a combination of lecture, discussion, and group project. The lecture period will be used to introduce new topics and to practice and review student assignments. To optimize classroom time, it is important to prepare for class BEFORE class. As a rule of thumb, two hours outside of class are needed for every one hour in class. Grading points will be earned through midterm examinations, final examination, quizzes, and homework.

**SLO (Student Learning Outcomes) for this course:**

1. Demonstrate knowledge of the users of accounting information and forms or business ownership, risks and capitalization of each and prepare, analyze and evaluate the financial structure of a firm using corporate financial statements (and include the statement of cash flows).
2. Analyze and evaluate the capitalization of a firm using debt and equity and apply net present value methodology to the analysis.
