Subject: De Anza Graduates 2010-11 to 2011-12

The tables below provide a comparison of graduates that received a Chancellor's Office approved degree or certificate in the 2010-11 or 2011-12 academic year.

Overall, the results show that graduation rates for students enrolled within the year they graduated have remained stable from 2010-11 to 2011-12.

Table 1. Full-year Enrollment and Graduates

The data shows that 3.54% of students enrolled in 2010-11 graduated within the same year compared to 3.69% of students enrolled in 2011-12. This shows a very small increase in graduates, about .15 of a percentage point.

In 2010-11, 1,703 degrees were awarded to 1,440 unique students.

84 students were awarded degrees in 2010-11 though not enrolled in 2010-11.

In 2011-12, 1,830 degrees were awarded to 1,511 unique students,

107 students were awarded degrees in 2011-12 though not enrolled in 2011-12.

Table 2. Spring Enrollment and Graduates

Of the students enrolled in spring 2011, 4.18% graduated within the 2010-11 academic year while 4.47% of students enrolled in spring 2012 graduated within the 2011-12 academic year. This shows an increase of .29 of a percentage point from year-to-year.
