- Transfers to CSU are steadying out with an increase from 2011-12 to 2013-14 of 4%, after a three-year trend in decreased transfers due to restrictive transfer policies such as frozen spring transfers and the removal of the local service agreement at San Jose State.
- The highest number of transfers in 2013-14 are to San Jose (58%), followed by San Francisco (17%) and East Bay (10%).

• In all three years, Asian students transferred at the highest rate making up over 37% of all transfers. White students comprised 21%-18% of all transfers over three years. Latino students made up 15%-17% of all transfers. Latino students show the largest gains in transfers with a 22% increase from 2011-12 to 2013-14.

- Between 2009-10 and 2011-12, there was an increase in transfers to out-of-state institutions by 14%.
