SYLLABUS

Scope: This course is designed to expose you to a wide range of Medieval and Renaissance art including painting, sculpture and architecture. We will be traveling throughout the Western world, exploring art from the beginnings of Christianity through to the "Re-birth" of art and culture, and we will see how each artist builds on the works of his/her predecessors until art crescendos with the genius of Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo. Included in this survey of art, we will also investigate and assess the role art plays in cultures and societies.

Arts 2B Student Learning Outcomes: Students will analyze the social experiences of artists, demonstrating how artists' relationships with their patrons was a defining factor in the production of works of art. Students will demonstrate visual literacy and critical thinking skills by evaluating diverse scholarly perspectives when interpreting of works of art. Students will investigate different techniques utilized in the production of works of art through written analysis based on firsthand evaluation of original art objects.

Reading: We will be reading Lives of the Artists by Giorgio Vasari as well as several articles.

Paper: The paper assignment will require a deep focus on an artwork we have seen in Florence or Rome. Further details will be discussed in class. Please note that I will not accept papers that have been written with any percentage of AI. I am much more interested in your ideas and your thoughts than in computer-generated words.

Readings work together with the material we cover in class. Completing the reading assignments will help you to contribute to class discussions.
