**I. COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

ESL 251 (a two-unit credit course) and ESL 451 (an equivalent noncredit class) is a high-intermediate listening and speaking class designed to increase your listening comprehension in a variety of contexts, to improve your speaking skills with the development of vocabulary appropriate in both formal and informal situations, and to improve your note-taking ability. Students taking 451 are expected to follow the policies that are required for 251 students.

**II. STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

- Demonstrate understanding of essential points of discussions or speeches on selected topics.
- Recognize and demonstrate level-appropriate spoken American English in class discussions and speeches on selected topics.

III. **COURSE CONTENT:** We will listen to audio lectures, take notes, and answer comprehension questions in class and for homework. Some homework will be written and some voice recorded. Students will engage in speaking activities, conduct interviews. Additionally, students must complete extra Listening and/or Speaking Practice. See Assignment handout for complete instructions.

IV. **ATTENDANCE:** In a listening and speaking class, attendance and participation are required. You are expected to attend all class meetings. For courses meeting only once a week, students should not miss more than one class during the entire quarter. Students will not receive any points on missed class days. If you miss a class, it is your responsibility to submit the assignments on time and come to the next class prepared. You may be dropped from the course if you have excessive absences. You may find it helpful to get the names and contact information of two classmates. However, you are not required to give this information to anyone. If you drop the class, **it's your responsibility to drop online or you will receive an "F"**.
