**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course emphasizes listening comprehension and proficiency in speaking in academic settings, and expression of students' ideas using a variety of speaking strategies, along with development of vocabulary, pronunciation and note-taking skills.

### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES (SLOs):

- Produce comprehensible low advanced spoken English on academic topics through one-on-one, group and public speaking situations.
- Demonstrate listening comprehension of a variety of low advanced materials, including academic lectures, newscasts, dialogues and interviews by taking notes and answering questions.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

- A. Use appropriate spoken American English in discussions and for given functions on a variety of academic topics.
- B. Use the appropriate spoken American English grammar for a given function with allowance for a few gross errors.
- C. Demonstrate oral competency by listening to and answering comprehension questions on both literal and inferred meaning.

- D. Exhibit appropriate note-taking skills on passages including lectures, newscasts, discussions, conversations, and interviews.
- E. Analyze and apply cross-cultural customs and attitudes by comparing and contrasting them with the students' own.
- F. Demonstrate clear pronunciation and adequate rate of speech appropriate to the low-advanced level of English fluency.

### **COURSE POLICIES:**

**Attendance**: Plan to attend every class and always arrive a few minutes before class begins. Students who miss class any time during the first two weeks will automatically be dropped. If you are absent or late, please contact your study-buddy or check Canvas to find out what you missed. Quizzes and graded assignments under the *participation category* cannot be made-up.

**Academic Honesty:** Academic dishonesty regarding tests in this class is defined as using resources not made available by me to everyone in the class during the testing time. Academic dishonesty includes plagiarism. *Plagiarism* means to give the teacher someone else's writing and say that you wrote it. Plagiarism includes using someone else's words or ideas on <u>any</u> assignment. You will receive a zero on any work that you do not do yourself.
